• **Do not enter** the rink area until the **final bell** has sounded. When entering, please be mindful of ongoing games and avoid causing any distractions.

County & National Games

• If a game is expected to **run past the scheduled rink changeover time**, please use the "**Competition In Progress**" boards to prevent members from walking across the end of the rinks. These boards (2 each end) are on a hook at both ends of the rinks. Please return them after use.

Bowlr - Booking Etiquette

- When booking a rink on Bowlr:
 - List the names of all players.
 - o If some names are not yet known, enter your **full name** followed by the number of additional players (e.g., John Smith + 3).
- If you book a rink and **do not attend**, you are still required to **pay the rink fee**. This applies to **all bookings**, including county and national games.
- Rinks can be cancelled without charge if cancelled at least 24 hours in advance.
- One-hour sessions can only be booked on the day of play, and must include the start and end times (e.g, John Smith 09:00–10:00).
