Update on Car Park Flooding

There has been an ongoing problem with water from the Botany Stream backing up through the car park drains at times of high river levels following heavy rain and it is expected this will occur with increasing frequency due to climate change. One-way valves designed to prevent this have proven ineffective.

Meetings have been held with the Environment Agency, the leader of TMBC and the Borough Engineer. It is proposed that a complete redesign of the valves takes place and work is scheduled for mid-March when the EA will be lowering the river level for annual maintenance.

Luckily, we haven't been plagued recently by ground water flooding into the Bowls Hall ditches. This is a much less frequent occurrence, and it is less understood about the conditions when this occurs. A sight gauge has been installed to the rear of the building to monitor ground water levels.

Bowls Hall carpet

The Bowls Hall carpet was stretched on 9th January to ensure that it complies with the EIBA specification for the speed of the carpet as we play County and National competitions at the Club.

Before re-tension the speed of the bowling surface was 17.2 seconds (over 27 metres) and after re-tension it was 17.7 seconds. Now us mere mortals might think the speed of the carpet was *slower* after re-tension than before. However, this is not the case and it is in fact *faster* (as is expected) after re-tension.

We asked Peter Harris if he could explain this conundrum for the benefit of those (like the editor) for whom it's a complete mystery. This is what he said – here comes the science bit!

“The maintenance of the green involves re-stretching the carpet over the carpet grips in the ditches. The work is akin to tightening the skin on a drum.

Time for bowl to travel 27m: Before, 17.2 seconds and after, 17.7 seconds.

As a side note, this is the approximate speed of the green at Potter's for the 2024 World Championships.

Anyway, I was asked to try to explain how the work had made the bowls slower.

Let's consider a thought experiment in the home environment where the challenge is to roll a marble exactly 2 metres. Firstly, on the living room carpet. Secondly, on the lino' covered floor in the kitchen. It is assumed that both are level.

More energy will be required to propel the marble the distance on the carpet because of the lagging property of the surface. On the other hand, the marble on the lino' will only need a gentle push for it to trundle on and on to its destination.

So, on the slower surface (carpet), the marble runs faster: on the faster surface (lino'), the marble runs more slowly. As a consequence of the work, we have an extra half a second to wait for the bowl to travel 27m. For an end of triples this means waiting an extra 9 seconds for the 18 bowls

to make their journey. In a match of 14 ends, it would add up to 2 minutes of extra travel time. Of course, this would only be true if all bowls in the match travelled exactly 27 metres (hmm, unlikely). Thank you Peter.

A further subject ... how does temperature affect the speed of the green? For another time!

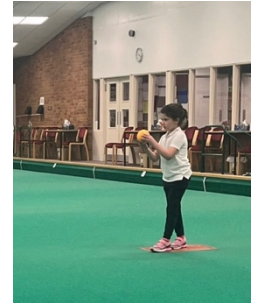

Landline telephone switch.

The old copper network in place right now has been in use for over a century. From 2024/2025, though, all phones will go through broadband lines. This means that "landlines" as we know them will now be serviced by VoIP, or "voice over internet protocol"- in other words, your phone calls will go through the internet.

The following information may be helpful to some of our older members, or younger ones with elderly relatives.

Your home phone service will be delivered over a digital broadband connection. BT and some other providers call it 'Digital Voice'

Customers should be contacted at least four weeks in advance before making the switch, to ensure they are ready to move to Digital Voice. You will not need to pay extra for any of this.

YOUR PROVIDER WILL SUPPORT CUSTOMERS WHO HAVE AGE OR HEALTH RELATED NEEDS

To get this support, you need to inform your provider in advance.

For example:

- Customers with a healthcare pendant also called a lifeline
- Customers who only use landlines and have no mobile phone.
- Customers in an area with no mobile signal.
- Customers who have disclosed any additional needs.

DIGITAL VOICE WILL NOT WORK DURING A POWER CUT

If there's a power cut or your broadband fails, Digital Voice won't work, including 999 calls, but you'll still be able to use a mobile phone if you have one.

You need to alert your provider to your situation if any of the following apply to you:

- You have a healthcare pendant or wristband connected to your landline.
- You *only* use a landline, and don't have a broadband router for wi-fi
- You have a poor mobile signal in your home, or don't use a mobile
- You have a disability such as poor hearing, limited vision, or poor mobility.

BT is asking that those without a mobile phone or a reliable mobile signal should call them on **0330 1234 150**. If you're one of these people, they may be able to fit a backup battery in your home to enable a digital landline to stay connected at all times.
