

Bowling Hall Lighting



We also now benefit from improved emergency lighting. Should the building suffer a power cut we now have emergency lighting coming on in the bowling hall ceiling as well as on the side walls. This will provide a much safer environment should the bowling hall be busy when the lights go out.... and meets best practice health & safety requirements.

Club Electricity Usage

For members' interest, the Club was savvy enough to secure fixed rate electricity and gas prices back in 2021. These will give us stability of costs through to the end of 2025 / early 2026. These fixed rates represent an increase of 25% and 42% on what we are currently paying (the new contracts have yet to take effect) but are significantly lower than current business electricity and gas rates.

On the above basis, we expect to be able to continue to afford to heat & air-condition the Club to a comfortable level whenever open. It is, nevertheless, clear that now more than ever we all need to save on

electricity wherever we can. And one way we can all do this is to actively manage the bowling hall lighting. Whilst the new lighting is much more efficient, it would still make a material difference if we all habitually switched off the lights on rinks that aren't needed.

For those unaware, the bowling hall light switches are to the left of the bar on a panel behind the desks. Please familiarise yourself with the lighting panel and please help us better manage the lights.

In a similar vein, we have also adjusted the air conditioning and hot water systems to save money where we can. In particular, the air conditioning / heating systems are now switched off over-night, coming on (hopefully) early enough each morning to ensure the building is comfortable for our first bowlers. Please let the Club Stewards know if at any time you find the building environment uncomfortable.

Club 2022 Open Weekend

We had a great Open Weekend; welcoming 115 visitors over the 2 days. Thank you to everyone who helped in any way. The feedback from our visitors was again very positive, especially regarding the friendliness of our volunteers and the warm welcome they received.

As a result, we now have 55 adults enjoying their 4 free Taster Sessions, plus another 15 or so attending our Saturday afternoon family sessions. Thank-you also to everyone helping with those Tasters.

Fingers crossed, we will then have a good number of new members joining us over the coming weeks and will be holding dedicated new bowler roll ups, leagues, and ladders to support their integration into our Club over the coming months. Do please give all our new members a warm welcome.

Rink Booking & Rink Fees

The following clarifications around our booking of rinks and rink fees has been agreed by your Directors and Bowling Committee, and are effective immediately....

1 Advance Booking of short sessions

The Club encourages members to use rinks for private practice, especially where the rinks would otherwise be empty. An hours private practice (rink fee just £1.75!) can be really beneficial to consistency. However, to ensure rinks are not 'blocked' at busy times, we need to ask that advance booking of individual rinks for less than the full session is only made within 24 hours of that session. Also, if you do advance-book a partial session, please clearly state your start time and end time in your rink diary booking.

The Club Stewards will ask for the full £4 session charge for any rinks booked ahead of the 24-hour window.

2. Rink Fee for "double rinks" (needed for County & National competitions).

This has been increased from £5 to £6. It is felt by both Directors and Bowling Committee that this remains a fair and competitive rate. All other rink fees remain unchanged.

3. Bowlr booking

Please ensure all rink usage is recorded in Bowlr. This includes advance bookings and 'drop-ins'. This will help both the club monitor usage and the Stewards manage proper collection of rink fees.

4. Rink Usage Priorities

We have a good number of our members entering National and County competitions this year. We have also entered all of the various National & County team competitions. Very occasionally, the need to complete these games by the stipulated deadlines will place pressure on rink availability. The Bowling Committee may then need to make a call on priorities for rink space. If rinks booked for roll-ups or internal leagues or competitions ever need to be moved in such situations all affected members will, of course, be consulted before-hand.

Bowling Update


John Forsey Bowls shop will be visiting the club at 10am on Tuesday 18th October. They will bring a selection of bowls, clothing and equipment for sale.
